Dental Care

Periodontal disease is the most common health problem in dogs and cats, affecting approximately 75% of our pets. Just like we go to the dentist to get our teeth cleaned, our pets should have regular check-ups and teeth cleanings too. Give us a call today to schedule an examination and to discuss what you can do at home to protect your pet's smile.

Surgery

Spaying and neutering animals at an early age can have health and behavioral benefits. Spaying a female before the first heat can significantly reduce the chances of acquiring breast cancer later in life, and will prevent infections or cancer of the uterus. Castrating a male will decrease the risk of marking or spraying. We schedule routine surgeries Monday through Friday.
